MEETING MINUTES of Hascombe Parish Council Meeting held on **Monday 14th January 2019** Hascombe Village Hall, Mare Lane, Hascombe at 7.00pm.

19/001 **Declarations of Interest**
There were no declarations of interest pertaining to agenda items.

19/002 **Representations from members of the public**
Members of the Hascombe Bonfire Committee advised that due to restricted access to the Hascombe Court field and a shortage of volunteers, it was not likely that the Bonfire Night would be held in 2019. Waverley’s Health and Safety requirements meant that the cricket pitch could not be used, therefore it would be necessary to find another location. The parish council would write to the owner of Hascombe Court seeking guaranteed access for 2020.

19/003 **Minutes**
The minutes of the meeting of the Parish Council held 26th November, as circulated, were approved as a correct record of the meeting and signed by the Chairman.

19/004 **Chairman’s Report**
The Chairman advised that he was due to have a meeting with Winkworth Arboretum concerning cars queuing for the gates to open in the mornings and also regarding their future plans.

The Chairman would attend a meeting with UKPN arranged by Mrs Nash concerning the frequency of power cuts in the village.

19/005 **Clerk’s Report**
There was nothing to report.

19/006 **Highways, Bridleways & Footpaths**
Mr Dwyer advised that he was awaiting a start date for contractors to put down scalplings on the access road to the Mare Lane bungalows. Regarding the Mare Lane verges, Mr Dwyer would follow up with Cllr Victoria Young as there had been no response to the quotations and the parish council’s offer

The hedge between the Fountain and the pub had been cut although the parish council's contractor couldn't do the higher branches as the road would need to be closed.
