Mr Dwyer had enquired whether the funds could be used towards the parking verges in Mare Lane, but this was not possible. <b>18/057</b>	<p><b>Items for information or inclusion on a future agenda</b></p> <p>Mr Dwyer requested an item on the next agenda to discuss communications, for example, the use of local websites and whether the parish council should get involved in passing information on.</p>	Clerk
<b>18/058</b>	<p><b>General Matters</b></p> <p>Mrs Nash was setting up Speedwatch, which had lapsed, and volunteers would be needed.</p> <p>Cllr Seaborne advised that there had been a recent meeting of a large number of travellers in Bramley, Broadwater and Shalford and that the security of sites was important. It was noted that Hascombe playing field is not secure.</p> <p>Cllr Seaborne reported that he is involved in the economic strategy for Waverley and concentrating on the rural economy. He asked the parish council to advise any issues we would like considered, for example to promote walking in the area which may benefit the White Horse. Other economic issues for consideration would include broadband/home-working, mobile signal, farming. He requested feedback as soon as possible.</p>
